June 3 – Dr. Fred Lowe gave the sermon titled "Come Follow Me." He gave insightful details of the relationships between the disciples and Jesus that we may not have known. If we are to become fishers of men, follow what Jesus says and He will fill your nets. Asher Suat gave a beautiful rendition of the song "In the Beginning."





June 10 - Tina Chew was the guest speaker. Her powerful sermon was titled, "Safe House." The beautiful Special Music, by Maricel Ebora was. "Unshakable Kingdom." The sermon touched on the trauma we may experience in our lives. She spoke about the woman at the well and the shame and guilt she felt. She said "No matter how messy your past is, Jesus sees your worth." She shared her personal testimony and the trauma she experienced in the past. With an addict for a mother and a father just released from prison, she was placed in a group home from which she ran away from. With only the clothes on her back and the shoes on her feet, the Lord sent a friend to help her. She was placed in an SDA foster home. There she learned about God and gave her heart to him when she was 18 years old. She credits the Capital SDA Church for mentoring her and the youth for welcoming her. She recommended the book "Why Am I Like This" to anyone who has suffered trauma.
